Who is required to have a trip permit?

- ◆ Nevada law (NRS 706) allows for the purchase of a trip permit in lieu of registration under NRS 482.
 - Nevada Base
 - IRP
 - Dual Registration
- ◆ Any person operating a Commercial Motor Vehicle (10,001 lb or more) in interstate commerce without IRP or dual registration.
- ◆ NOTE: Vehicles 26,001 or more must also purchase a fuel permit if not registered through IFTA.

What happens if I do not purchase a trip permit?

- ◆ Roadside Enforcement (NHP) – Citation – Criminal (misdemeanor)
 - A Citation is issued for the criminal penalties and fines.
- ◆ Administrative Enforcement (DMV) – Audit – Civil
 - The citation or notice is forwarded to DMV where an audit is generated to assess an Administrative Fine for the violation of the Nevada Revised Statutes and recover the permit.
 - Administrative Fines begin at \$500 and progressively increase to \$2,500 for repeat violations.
 - Driver and Company are jointly liable.

Where can I purchase trip permits?

- ◆ Permitting Service Agencies –
- ◆ DMV offices with Motor Carrier Services (walk-in)
- ◆ NOTE: Permits must be purchased prior to entry into the State and can be pre-purchased.

When do I need a trip permit?

- ◆ Operating a CMV without apportioned or dual registration.
- ◆ Operating a CMV with apportioned or dual registration if Nevada is not included in the fees.
- ◆ Moving a vehicle within the State that does not have valid registration.

Why do I need a trip permit?

- Maintenance of our infrastructure and roadways.
- Keeps a level playing field.
- Nevada law requires a permit in lieu of valid registration.

Statutory Authority

NRS 706.491 – Motor Carriers must be licensed.

NRS 706.521 – Temporary Permit for certain motor vehicles; fees.

NRS 706.756 - Unlawful acts; criminal penalties.

Statutory Authority – Fuel Permits

NRS 366.220 – Mandatory licensing requirements; restriction on authority to sell or distribute dyed special fuel; regulations of Department.

NRS 366.223 - Temporary permit for special fuel; regulations of Department.

NRS 366.720 - Unlawful acts; criminal penalties.
