Resolution 5-04

Federal Support for Branch Line Railroads

- **Whereas,** the rail branch lines are an important component of the western state's and the nation's transportation networks; and
- Whereas, the Rail Rehabilitation and Improvement Financing (RRIF) Program was authorized in 1998 to make up to \$3.5 billion in loans and loan guarantees to:
 - Acquire, improve, or rehabilitate intermodal or rail equipment or facilities,
 - Refinance outstanding debt for the purpose listed above, and
 - Develop or establish new intermodal or railroad facilities; and
- Whereas, by early 2004 only about \$350 million of this funding has been utilized, and
- Whereas, many potential users of the RRIF program feel it has not been user-friendly and conducive to moving resources into needed projects.
- Now, therefore be it resolved, that the WASHTO states urge the FRA to simplify administration of the RRIF program so its authorized funds can be fully utilized; and
- **Be it further resolved,** WASHTO supports continued Federal support for short line railroads through either RRIF or a successor program from a funding source other than the Highway Trust Fund; and
- **Be it further resolved,** WASHTO supports the appropriation of funds for the purpose of the RRIF or a successor program.
