New Legislation: Moved Port of Entry from Department of Revenue to Colorado State Patrol within the Department of Public Safety	
Permitting System Updates: (Please include money or time saving changes) A consultant has been hired to assist with system requirements for a new system. W hope to ave final funding approval for a new sytem soon.	
Procedural Changes: Once staffing shortages and I.T. obstacles are resolved, the initial bridge structural analysis for loads > 200k will be performed by permit office staff. Additionally, all statewide regional approvals are now being handled by permit office staff paving the way for continuous movement of these loads. Previously each region instituted their own restrictions making operations difficult for carriers due to inconsistencies. This also decreases turn around times for these permits.

New Legislation: No new legislation planned at this time by the Department	
Permitting System Updates: (Please include money or time saving changes) Currently Idaho is in the process of working with our partner 3M to modernize all DMV systems. Motor Carrier Services (permitting and registrations) will be the 4th and final phase which has a current completion date of late 2014 or early 2015.	
Procedural Changes:	
Innovative or Special Initiatives: Idaho is toward the end of conducting a 10 year special pilot project that allows vehicle combinations to operate at 129,000 pounds on certain non-interstate highways. The vehicle combination must not exceed legal interior and exterior bridge weights and must comply with enhanced safety and reporting requirements. This project will end in 2013.	
New/Unique Communication Efforts: (Describe any outreach to your carrier population) Motor Carrier Services produces a quarterly electronic newsletter titled "E-Trails" to customers who subscribe. Customers can sign up for for this electronic newsletter via our trucking.idaho.gov website which also contains online services and information. Motor Carrier Services also produces a Truckers handbook which contains information pertaining to permitting and registration requirements for customers. Supplemental information in the handbook details fuel tax, commercial safety, important contact numbers, etc.,. Motor Carrier Services also conducts yearly Motor Carrier Seminars where customers not only receive new information pertaining to registration and permitting, but can ask questions pertinent to their needs.	
Special Challenges Affecting Permit Operations: There is an increase in requests for larger and heavier loads. These do not qualify for annual overlegal permits and thus take more time and coordination with other department personnel. These increases in the number of overweight single trip overlegal permits require more bridge analysis to be completed due to deteriorating infrastructure. Construction restrictions rise during the spring, summer and fall which coincides with the busy season for overlegal permit requests. Detouring customers away from their preferred route, requiring additional pilot cars and longer distances impact both customer and the traveling public.	
Uniformity Pursuits: Idaho/WASHTO is working with the Northwest Passage group on recommendations for harmonization of specific overlegal permit requirements (flagging, lighting and signing). Other harmonization efforts will include pilot car and time of travel requirements.	
Areas of Concern: There is a concern on the impacts of MAP21 not only on Idaho but other states in regards to future designated freight corridors, permitting of overlegal loads, additional restrictions, limitations or freezes placed on highways, reporting requirements and etc. Another concern is the increased rate of infrastructure deterioration and the increasing size and weight of overlegal vehicles/loads.	

There seems to be an increasing resistance by environmental organizations toward the movement of overlegal vehicles/loads.

Successes: The implementation of the truckers only page on the 511 traveler information system has been a great resource for annual permit holders and staff. Annual permit customers use this website to locate and route their overlegal vehicles/loads around construction restrictions and closed roads, since that is their responsibility as an annual permit holder. Staff has a consolidated location for statewide construction restrictions only affecting permitted vehicles/loads that they utilize to complete routing of vehicles/loads when issuing single trip overlegal permits. Our ITD district personnel enter the restrictions into the system at least two weeks in advance if not sooner so that staff and industry can plan and route accordingly.

New Legislation: 2011 legislature transferred os/ow permitting and size/weight administrative enforcement from TxDOT to TxDMV. This was accomplished January 2012. The TxDMV Motor Carrier Division consists of Permitting, TxIRP, and Motor Carrier Credentialing.	
Permitting System Updates: (Please include money or time saving changes) Texas Permitting and Routing Optimization System (TxPROS) development project close-out August 2012, moved into maintenance/enhancement phase. In its first year of operations, TxPROS provided ability to improve customer service while managing a 25% increase, issue permits and routes in minutes versus hours, reduce telephone hold times to under 5 minutes, increase fee collections, improve program consistency/transparency and provide a greater range of data for analysis. On the customer side, TxPROS provides ability for carriers to self-issue majority of permits, manage users, equipment inventories, financials, etc. All of this saves time and money.	
Procedural Changes: Because of TxPROS, we have streamlined processes and there is more consistency in the way permit rules are applied.	
Innovative or Special Initiatives: Ongoing business process improvements; Texas Energy Sector Task Force, which is an attempt to bring state agencies, locals and industry together to proactively address community transportation infrastructure and safety needs resulting from energy production activities.	
New/Unique Communication Efforts: (Describe any outreach to your carrier population) TxPROS training and outreach - classroom training, webinars, short online videos covering specific TxPROS training subjects, carrier call-backs after first TxPROS use.	
Special Challenges Affecting Permit Operations: A lot of change at once!	
Uniformity Pursuits: Continue working through WASHTO/AASHTO committees.	
Areas of Concern: Harmonization, credit card fees	
Successes: TxPROS implementation and integration. Effectively managing 25% volume increase while improving service. Successful/ongoing implementation of "Communication and Service Plan" with TxDOT to ensure continued coordination and restriction management.
