New Legislation: For 2013, we will revise SB48 that failed in 2011; it will clarify agency authority, admin fines, penalties, definitions, exceptions.

Permitting System Updates: (Please include money or time saving changes)
We have had set-backs because NV lost CVISN funding in 2011 which included a new ODV
PS. We are now prepping a new Technology Investment Request for a consolidated
CV/OS/OW Vehicle PS (FY13-14 Budget); anticipate issuing a RFP in 6-12 months; we expect to include highway restrictions manager and route screening functions.

Procedural Changes:

- 1. In 2011, added "LCV" and "divisible" definitions to regs.
- 2. Proposing reorganization of OS/OW/ODV administrative code for early 2012 to simplify and clarify it; also add new definitions, police escort requirements, WRP authorizaton; permit suspension rules; high profile vehicle rules; state advisory committee procedures.
- 3. Revised bridge restrictions database and mapping being prepped; will be much more extensive than past restrictions with greater impact on permittees; may be able to expand our annual permit envelopes though.

Innovative or Special Initiatives:

- 1. NDOT and interagency reorganization study underway to evaluate and improve permitting and related trucking functions; maybe reconstituting ODV Permits Office with added staff capabilities and additional emphasis on cross-training and compliance.
- 2. Drafting an Interagency Joint Ops Statement and an Interagency 5-Year Strategic Plan for Highway Transport.

New/Unique Communication Efforts: (Describe any outreach to your carrier population) Will consolidate NDOT truck services web sites with DMV (Motor Carrier) and DPS/NHP; will include web portal to new permitting and route screening system.

Special Challenges Affecting Permit Operations: Staff, time and \$\$\$

Uniformity Pursuits: Recommend (1) WASHTO COHT continue to investigate a centralized WRP permit and restriction system, that automatically taps into each state's 511 or highway restriction manager and allows state's better control/visibility; (2) upgrade committee web site; (3) coordinate meetings with AASHTO SCOHT to expand participation and save costs; (4) use AASHTO registration/fee billing system.

Areas of Concern: Improve individual state's ability to audit and control WRPs being issued on its behalf and to eliminate misrouting.

Permitting System Updates: (Please include money or time saving changes)
Completing full TxPROS integration and evaluating needs. Since day one of implementation,
50+ of customers have self-issued withint the pre-set envelope of 16' wide, 16'6" tall, 180k, and
110 long. TxPROS has improved our work environment, customer service and reporting
capabilities much more quickly than anticipated. We are currently evaluating processes,
performance metrics, organizational structure, etc based on new operating environment
TxPROS provides. Because of the increased ability to meet customer (latent) demand, in
addition to economic factors, we are on track to issue more than 700,000 permits in fiscal year
2012, about an 18% increase over FY 2011's record-breaking year.

Procedural Changes: In transition

Innovative or Special Initiatives: In transition with TxPROS integration as well as division transfer to TxDMV effective 1/1/12.

New/Unique Communication Efforts: (Describe any outreach to your carrier population) quarterly newsletter, social media (FB, Twitter), Superload Common Interest Group, outreach/attendance at numerous shipper and carrier industry events to tell our story and improve collaboration. Developed/implemented ongoing TxPROS Communication and Education Plan.

Special Challenges Affecting Permit Operations: Transitions, new operating environment and 18% permit volume increase over last year. Development of the Eagle Ford Shale, which stretches across 30 south Texas Counties, is expected to play out for decades. Learning from the lessons of Barnet Shale, TxDOT, TxDMV, counties, industry and other regulatory agencies are working practively to address infrastructure needs, economic and housing needs, employment and other issues in what was previously a largely rural/ranching area of the state.

Uniformity Pursuits: Continue working with relevant WASHTO and AASHTO committees. Currently cleaning up and modernizing administrative rules - will ensure WASHTO minimum standards are met. Developing legislative agenda items for 2013 sessions to aid in uniformity pursuits.

Areas of Concern: Lots of change and associated change management

Successes: TxPROS has been our primary focus over the past 18 months and has been extremely successful.

Other: Integrating with existing TxDMV functions (TxIRP and credentialing) to further one-stop-shop efforts, proposed statutory revisions to streamline and modernize. Continue collaborating with TxDOT (post-transfer) to ensure open lines of communication.
