- Welcome and Introductions: 2 new members attended for Texas and Idaho.
 - ➤ Jason Duncan, PE
 Texas Deputy Director Construction Division with 15 years of field experience. Jason oversees the claims process resulting from escalated project issues unresolved at lower levels.

- How to encourage team partnering when there is no facilitator:
 - Agencies without a formal partnering program or facilitator conduct staff training.
 - ➤ Training includes soft skills, understanding what partnering is and isn't, processing change orders (design, quantities, etc.), following the escalation process and developing "project first" behaviors. Click HERE for Technology of Participation (ToP) facilitation skills training.
 - > Partnering elements do not supersede contract specifications.
 - > Training is most often facilitated through the local AGC partners or consultant trainers.

CalTrans: Training provided using a consultant trainer and includes senior leaders, project managers, inspectors, senior engineers, resident engineers (RE) and superintendents. Each district has a project team member who is the designated Partnering Champion. Click <u>HERE</u> for partnering program information and a list of consultant facilitators.

Nevada: Training is accomplished through a consultant and AGC partnership which includes a 1 day training course focused on soft skills. Partnering is required on every project The RE and Contractor agree as to formal or informal format and whether to hire a consultant or self-facilitate with trained personnel. Utah: The Partnering Certification course is required. Failure to comply results in a portion of the first mobilization payment being withheld. The 1.5 day course is provided by a consultant trainer in the AGC facility. Click **HERE** for Utah partnering program information.

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Washington: We have trained about 600 contractors and WSDOT staff since 2016, including field staff, Project Managers, Project Engineers, etc. It's open to everyone including local agencies. Part of the workshop is a negotiation session that is designed to create win-win situations. There's also a lot of discussion about what partnering is and isn't. We also have a Contractor's Creed and Owner's Creed in our Partnering Field Guide.

Texas: Provides training in dispute resolution once per month. There is also training on claims and use of the escalation process for district staff and the contractor PM.

Arizona: Uses in house facilitators who are trained in facilitation practices and soft skill applications. Consultant facilitators are procured and available at the request of the project team.

Partnering Value:

Quantitative - Data collected based on contract performance (contract time, budget, quantities, specifications, etc).

Texas: Contractor evaluations are required to be completed at project completion by the TxDOT Engineer. Evaluation results are tracked. Evaluations are based more on contract requirements with only 1 of 9 questions referring to partnering. Evaluations can be used to put the contractor on a performance plan, apply to all contracts statewide and can be used to reduce contractor bidding capacity. (See attached)

Washington: The RE is required to complete a Prime Contractor Evaluation which is considered in contractor pre-qualification. The contractor is provided a Resident Engineer Evaluation but completion of the document is voluntary. (See attached).

Utah: Provides a Partnering Evaluation for both the RE and contractor and evaluates specific aspects of the project overall. (See attached). The results of the contractor evaluation may affect future bidding opportunities.

California: Surveys are completed at project close out. Data from the surveys are available on an internal dashboard allowing CalTrans staff to evaluate outcomes and participation of the partnering project team.

- Qualitative Data based on customer satisfaction responses.
 - ★ Activities that <u>promote behavior</u> consistent with partnering principles.

 Most states have an award program allowing contractors to apply for partnering awards.
